To Our Residents and Family Members:

In our ongoing communication with you during the COVID-19 pandemic, **Bland County Nursing and Rehab** continues to issue communication regarding the status of our residents and employees. On February 2, 2022, we received confirmation that two employees and one resident tested positive for COVID-19. The employees have been removed from work and will be self-quarantining, and the resident has been relocated to our COVID unit where they will have a dedicated team providing care. **Our team at Bland County Nursing and Rehab remain committed to the quality and safe care of our residents.** We will continue to provide updates as additional information becomes available.

The safety and wellbeing of our residents continues to be our top priority. We are doing everything we can to prevent the spread of COVID-19 within **Bland County Nursing and Rehab**, including staying in very close communication with local and state health officials to ensure we are taking all the appropriate steps under current circumstances.

We are taking steps based on guidance from the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) and the Center for Medicare and Medicaid Services (CMS) to reduce the spread and impact of COVID-19, such as:

- Enhanced infection control precautions
- Screening residents, staff, and visitors for expanded list of symptoms
- Proactively testing staff and residents for COVID-19 based on current protocols
- Increasing PPE par levels
- And CDC/CMS recommendations

Due to government privacy requirements, we cannot divulge specific information about the individuals who have confirmed or suspected COVID-19, unless they are your family member, and you have the necessary permissions to receive such information. We will contact you directly if your loved one is suspected or diagnosed with COVID-19.

We also understand that connecting with family members is incredibly important to our residents. Additionally, we encourage family members to connect with their loved ones through video chat, calling, facetime, or visiting in person.
