To Our Residents and Family Members:

In our ongoing communication with you during the COVID-19 pandemic, **The Springs Nursing Center** continues to issue communication regarding the status of our residents and employees. On March 21, 2022, we received confirmation that one resident tested positive for COVID-19. However, per the Virginia Department of Health, a more accurate PCR test was administered and found the original positive result to be a false positive and the resident is negative for COVID-19. **Our team at The Springs Nursing Center remain committed to the quality and safe care of our residents.** We will continue to provide updates as additional information becomes available.

The safety and wellbeing of our residents continues to be our top priority. We are doing everything we can to prevent the spread of COVID-19 within **The Springs Nursing Center**, including staying in very close communication with local and state health officials to ensure we are taking all the appropriate steps under current circumstances.

We are taking steps based on guidance from the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) and the Center for Medicare and Medicaid Services (CMS) to reduce the spread and impact of COVID-19, such as:

- Enhanced infection control precautions
- Screening residents, staff, and essential visitors for expanded list of symptoms
- Proactively testing staff and residents for COVID-19 based on current protocols
- Increasing PPE par levels
- And CDC/CMS recommendations

Due to government privacy requirements, we cannot divulge specific information about the individuals who have confirmed or suspected COVID-19, unless they are your family member, and you have the necessary permissions to receive such information. We know you are concerned about your loved one, so we will contact you directly if your loved one is suspected or diagnosed with COVID-19.

We also understand that connecting with family members is incredibly important to our residents. Additionally, we encourage family members to connect with their loved ones through video chat, calling, Facetime, or visiting in person.
